Our History

- 2007 Paul and Richard founded Option C in Durham
- 2008 Secured Newcastle car club contract
- 2009 Expanded across the UK contracts with Council, NHS,
 Universities and developers
- 2012 First UK Car Club to introduce Electric Vehicles to fleet
- 2013 Rebranded to Co-wheels
- 2013 First 'visitor' cars in Lake District including Renault Twizzys
- 2014 Introduction of shared electric bicycles
- 2015 First cars into London
- 2015 Exceeded 5,000 members and 10,000 drivers
- 2016 Won Greenfleet UK Car Club operator of the year
- 2016 First car share in the world to introduce Hydrogen Fuel cell vehicles


Hexham - Results

Alnwick




East Lothian



East Lothian Car Club

- Locally managed franchise
- Board of volunteer directors
- Active Supporters group in each location
- Nine cars across three towns North Berwick, Haddington & Dunbar
- Formed from the merger of Easywheels car club in Haddington and SpareWheels in Dunbar.

Huntly



Huntly Car Club

- Most northerly and remote of our clubs
- Rural Aberdeenshire
- None of the groups associated with car sharing
- Community car club run as a Franchise
- 2 cars in Huntly
- Run by Huntly & District Development Trust
- Funded by the Climate Challenge Fund & Aberdeenshire Council

Successful Rural Car Clubs

- Franchise model (or visitor model eg Lake District)
- Local ownership & commitment
- Buy in & support from the local community
- More than one car!
- Funding especially for initial capital
- Backup & expertise from Co-wheels
 - 24 hour helpline
 - Website & booking system
 - Purchasing power
