 - Ageing population





This complexity together with the "scale" and "concentration" of that deprivation effectively hides it



North East Combined Authority

- Devolution Agreement for the North East
 - Rural Growth and Stewardship
 - Rural Transport
 - Superfast Broadband
- Mayoral Combined Authority
 - Will have a "Rural Affairs" lead on the Cabinet
 - Agreement that the proposed North East Investment Fund will incorporate rural proofing as part of programme/project assessment



Borderlands Initiative

- Local authority-led collaboration across Cumbria, Dumfries and Galloway, Northumberland and Scottish Borders
- Population of over 1 million people, with 14 million within a drive time of 2 hours
- Accounts for the equivalent GVA (£18bn) of the UK's economy as that of Tyneside (£17.1bn) or the City of Edinburgh (£18.6bn)
- Has some traction with both the UK and Scottish governments – and currently pulling together a strategic proposition that builds on the area's collective strengths for both to consider

 - Voluntary and community sector
 - Town and parish councils
 - DEFRA family of organisations
 - Private sector
